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Precious Blood Week in Kisasa Dodoma

Blessed Be the Blood of Christ!

We thank God for the opportunity we had to participate in the Precious Blood Week Conference held in the parish of the Virgin Mary Queen of the Precious Blood in Kisasa, Diocese of Dodoma. The sisters who attended belonged to the Miyuji Community, Sr. Erica Thadei, Sr.Getruda Faustus, Sr. Agnes Andrea, Sr. Leticia Charles and Sr. Anjelister Erasmus, and the Hope Village Community, Sr. Maria Mathias, Sr. Delphina Thomas and Sr. Mariana Peter. The main topic was the Lamb:

- The Lamb in the Old Testament presented by Fr. Sosthenes Ndendya, C.PP.S
- The Lamb in the New Testament -presented by Fr. Benjamini Mwinuka, C.PP.S
- The Lamb in the Holy Mass presented by Fr. Abel Misanga, C.PP.S
- History of the Servant of God John Merlini presented by Fr. Simon Aloyce, C.PP.S

The first day we started by offering Mass presided over by the Provincial Superior of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood, Fr. Vedastus Ngowi, C.PP.S.

We learned that human beings prayed to God, sacrificed animals and even asked for forgiveness for slaughtering a lamb. We also saw that in the Old Testament, the kind of sacrifice they offered to God was a SACRIFICE FOR SIN, OF ATONEMENT, OF THANKSGIVING, OF PRAISE AND OF REDEMPTION. We also saw that the Lamb is a symbol of PEACE. (Isaiah 53:7)

On the second day we saw the Lamb in the New Testament, Christ himself, who restored to us what we had lost. Christ is the Lamb blessed with intelligence, who taught us to have a heart of RECONCILIATION, SACRIFICE AND PURIFICATION. Christ does away with all sacrifices in His body and unites us to make us one in Him. He is the peace and hope that we can give ourselves together with FAITH.

On the third day we saw the Lamb that is Christ Himself in the Mass offering Himself as food for people. People sacrificed animals, but Christ sacrificed Himself on the cross for redemption. Study Visit

In the region of Morogoro

On June 20 and 21, a study visit was held for some students from Maria De Mattias School in Dodoma. The students were taken by school buses from their places of residence as arranged by the school administration, and once everyone arrived at the school, Father Eugene Nchimbi, C.PP.S., led a moment of prayer before starting the journey. A total of 251 students and 17 staff and teachers left at 1:30 a.m.



At about 11 a.m., the group stopped in the Dakawa area to allow students to get in touch with and remember the death of Edward Moringe Sokoine, the former prime minister of the first phase of the Tanzanian government. Once they arrived in Morogoro, around 2 p.m., the students had lunch before visiting the farms of Sokoine University of Agriculture (SUA) where they witnessed fish farming. After visiting the college (SUA), the group visited the home of the Sisters Adorers of the Blood of Christ and ended the first day by visiting the

waterfall at the edge of the Uluguru Mountains where there is also a wildlife farm. Also in that area they learned about the behavior of wildlife and wild birds in the area.

On the second day, June 21, students and teachers woke up early in the morning to begin their journey to Mikumi National Park, accompanied by tour guides who told the history of the Mikumi Reserve and more. The students also saw wildlife and were instructed on the wildlife's behavior. They were very happy to see different environments.

After leaving the Mikumi reserve, the students and teachers had lunch and then returned Dodoma, where they arrived around 4 p.m. Parents were waiting for them at the school and greeted them with cheers and shouts.

The study visit to the Morogoro region was a successful event. Students were able to learn about the history and commemorate the death of Edward Moringe Sokoine (former Prime Minister) and gained insights into agriculture and fish farming. The overnight accommodations were good as well as the meal arrangements. The children and staff could also benefit from the health care of a nurse

in case they needed it. The school staff was punctual from early

morning and performed their duties with great care and professionalism. The experience was also possible because of the reliable transportation service, which was essential since cars were not available.

Indonesian Mission

Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not rely on your insight. In all your ways, acknowledge Him and He will make straight your paths. Do not be wise in your own eyes; fear the Lord and turn away from evil. [Prov. 3:5-7]

The dream of the India Region came true when three of us, Sr. Mini Vadakumchery, our Provincial; Sr. Mini Vadakumpadan and Sr. Renita travelled from India to Indonesia on April 21, 2024 at 7.15 pm. We reached Flores Island, Indonesia on April 23, 2024 evening. We experienced many hurdles and difficulties on our way before reaching the destination. We were staying at St. Camillious Social Centre for the first 10 days. Sr. Jisha, a Sister belonging to the Congregation of Divine Love of Jesus was supporting us from time to time when we landed in Indonesia.

We had gone different places to look for a house, convenient, spacious; and at the same time, at a reasonable rent. After a few days, we found a house for rent for our stay. Thereafter, we were busy in cleaning the house and setting up things and also buying various items like utensils, furniture, provisions etc. The house was blessed by Fr. Romo Datus, the Parish Priest on May 5, 2024 at 3.00 pm. Fr. Luiji, the Director of Camillious Social Centre, Fr. Donato, the Rector of Stymatine Novitiate House; Divine Love Sisters and a few candidates, our neighboring families were all present for the blessing. Thus, we began our ASC presence in Indonesia.

Almost 55% of the total population of Flores Island is Catholic and 90% Christians. There are lots of vocations every year to different Congregations. 48 Deacons are to be ordained in the coming days. We are surrounded by Catholic families. We started to go to the families every day to pray the Rosary with them and have meals together sitting in a circle and eating from the same plates. This was a very good experience. We did not know what language to speak to them and neither did we understand what they spoke to us. We observed everything in silence. From day one forward, we started using Google translator. Their food, culture, customs – everything was unknown to us, totally new in all respects.

We were feeling home-sick and lonely for few days in the beginning. It was mainly because of lack of communication with these people and we were also not able to connect to with other ASCs, friends and family members due to very poor internet connection. But we trusted in the Word of God [Jos 1:9] and St. Maria De Mattias' words: "Let us love the cross very much, for it is there that we discover our life, our true love and our strength in our greatest difficulties".

Strengthened and encouraged by these words, we continue to go ahead with learning a new language; getting to know their culture, custom, food etc. We thank, from the bottom of our hearts, our Regional Administration and all our sisters for accompanying us with their prayers and making us feel their love through phone calls.

We truly believe that the ASC charism and spirit are alive in new soil through the root of India Region. May St. Maria De Mattias intercede for us.



Tamal Regan Joins the Catholic Church

"A fun fact. I heard Sanctus bells ringing at the very moment that Fr. Tom and Fr. Immanual were elevating the host and chalice. Maybe you heard them too? At first, I thought nothing of it. Then I remembered that those bells aren't typically rung in the chapel, and I was slightly mortified to think it was my cellphone, the volume of which had to be turned up for Sr. Jenny to do the livestream. But then I laughed in my soul to think that these "Sanctus-sounding" bells, triggered by the security camera in my backyard, had rung exactly at that moment. The wind had set off the security camera and announced its arrival, demonstrating once again that the Spirit blows where it will. Holy, Holy, Holy.

XXVI Ordinary Regional Assembly

On June 1, 2024, at the Adorers of the Blood of Christ Convent in Zagreb (Miramarska cesta 100), the second plenary session of the XXVIth Ordinary Regional Assembly was held on the theme: "Making every season of one's life fruitful by living the paschal identity in the Church and society."

The work of the Assembly began with Holy Mass with Monsignor Nedjeljko Pintarić presiding. His words in the homily remained deeply imprinted in our minds and hearts, because they invited us to announce and witness with actions instead of words.

Keeping with the Assembly's program, in the morning we focused on the "triple evaluation" of the Guidelines established at the first plenary meeting. Sister Zdravka Leutar, regional superior, presented the results of an anonymous survey in which the sisters had the opportunity to answer questions about how they personally experienced the Guidelines. The second step of the evaluation focused on our joint projects, while the third focused on the decisions made for the care of elderly and sick sisters.

Afterwards, the project for the implementation of the online community of the Blood of Christ for youth, in collaboration with the Missionaries of the Precious Blood, was presented.

In the afternoon, the work of the Assembly focused on the 2023 GA Direction Statement and Acts, followed by work in groups based on the feedback from the in-depth study of the 2023 GA Direction Statement done in the communities prior to the plenary assembly. An attempt was made to identify the innovations and challenges we see in our Region as we approach the upcoming Elective Assembly.

Based on the results of the work presented in the plenary, an ad hoc committee proposed the text of the guidelines which, after a discussion, was approved.

The work together was concluded with an evaluation and prayer of thanksgiving to God, blessing each other.



Pilgrimage to Italy

From April 21-27, 2024, 45 pilgrims from Saint Maria De Mattias parish participated in a spiritual pilgrimage in Italy as part of the preparation for the parish's 10th anniversary.
